

# Panoramaland RC&D

In 2016, Panoramaland Resource Conservation & Development, RC&D, a Utah non-profit 501(c)3 organization headquartered in Richfield, received a USDA Rural Development grant to administer energy efficiency audits to Utah businesses and agricultural producers.

## Energy Efficiency Audit

Equipment identified in the **energy efficiency audit** could include energy efficient lighting, HVAC systems, refrigeration, heating and cooling, and more. Many of these systems present a reasonable payback period for businesses, especially when businesses can secure additional funding to install the equipment.

An **energy efficiency audit** will help identify and quantify energy savings opportunities. The discounted energy efficiency audit can be used to access federal grants such as the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP), and can help prioritize equipment investments by showing which energy efficiency projects are most cost-effective.
